Coherence is logical flow; cohesion is connection with linking words; both ensure the .¹

vocabulary improves clarity (e.g., "rapid" vs. "fast"); poor word choice can confuse Precise .²
.the meaning

.Grammar ensures structure and correctness; errors can distort meaning .³

interesting and Sentence structure refers to how a sentence is built; variety keeps writing .⁴
.avoids monotony

Punctuation clarifies meaning (e.g., "Let's eat, grandma!" vs. "Let's eat grandma!"); .⁵
.common errors include comma splices and misuse of apostrophes
